## Declaration on the regulation (EC) no. 1005/2009 & statement about California Proposition 65

Declaration on “Regulation (EC) no. 1005/2009 of the European Parliament and of the Council of September 16, 2009 on substances that lead to the depletion of the ozone layer,” last amended by delegated directive 2017/605 from March 29, 2017.

The products manufactured by Isabellenhütte Heusler GmbH & Co. KG do not fall under this directive according to annex 1 and 2 of the regulation (EC) 1005/2009.

The regulation is responsible for the production, import, export, placing on the market, use, recovery, recycling, reclamation and destruction of ozone-depleting substances, the communication of information about those substances as well as the import, export, placing on the market and use of products and equipment that contain or need such substances. The production of the substances regulated in the regulation (see annex) is prohibited. The placing on the market and use of regulated substances is prohibited.

This primarily relates to CFCs (chlorofluorocarbons) (today already illegal in many application areas) and HFCFCs (e.g. specific refrigerants) or HFCs.

Based on the products manufactured by Isabellenhütte under examination of the annex to the EC regulation, there is no known use of any of the substances listed in the annex.

There is thus compliance with the EC regulation, as it is not applicable to the Isabellenhütte’s product range, including the manufacturing processes. Due to the lacking application area of the regulation, no certificate regarding “non-use” is necessary either.

In addition, the requirements at the national level (ChemOzonschichtV – Chemical Ozone Layer Ordinance) are also complied with.

The California “Safe Drinking Water and Toxic Enforcement Act” from 1986, published in the “California Health & Safety Code Section 25249.6” is referred to as “California Proposition 65” or “CP65” for short.

The Proposition 65 list (published by OEHHA – as of Nov. 23, 2018) contains around 900 substances that have been declared as carcinogenic, mutagenic or hereditary (CMR) in the state of California. Isabellenhütte confirms compliance with the specifications of this list by comparing and testing the substances used. The specified limit values have been achieved.
